### Mission of the Center's Middle East Program

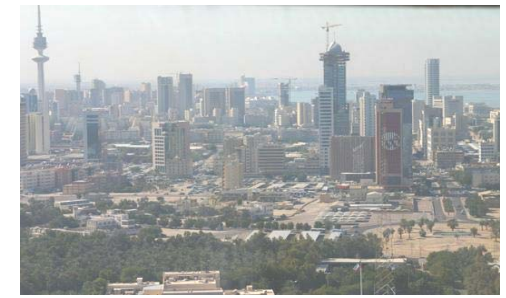
The prime mission of the Eurasia Center's new Middle East Program is to develop new and facilitate existing positive relations between the United States and Arab countries in Southwest Eurasia. The Eurasia Center is building an association of Middle East scholars who share in this vision. This new Middle East program will organize a group of scholars who will analyze the new trends being built between America and the Middle East and also the new dramatic relations developing with the Middle East and Eurasia.

There has been a surge in negative political articles concerning Islam and the Arab world. The Eurasia Center seeks to identify specific areas in which the United States and the Arab world that can achieve the most productive interactions, all the while maintaining mutual respect of each other's cultures to build new bridges for many years to come.

### Conference & Lecture Series

The Eurasia Center seeks to promote positive US relations with the Middle East through its new Middle East program. This program will highlight the important role of the Gulf Cooperation Council's efforts to bring stability and energy security to the world. This is a new effort by scholars and staff to work on initiatives, publications, lecture series and conferences to further this important mission.
